## Heidi says thanks

This is Heidi Rose she is 3 years old. When she was 11 weeks old she was diagnosed with long QT syndrome. For those that don't know, it's a heart condition that effects the electric current and rhythm of her heart which can lead to sudden death.

Heidi is a happy bright little girl that has just started pre school at Gorseybrigg primary school but due to her condition there are certain activities she can't take part in.

Her parents, family and friends have been raising money for a defibrillator for school and for staff to receive CPR training. Heidi's teacher got in touch with Hand on Heart and we stepped in and supplied the school with a defibrillator and training not only for staff but a class of children as well.

We would like to say a massive thank you to all at Hand on Heart, you truly are amazing"

Heidi's mum Sam commented "We are so grateful for this, as a family we found it hard letting Heidi go off to pre school but feel much more at ease knowing that every safety measure is in place.

We have now set up a campaign called "HEIDI'S HEART" where we are raising funds for Hand on Heart. Our aim is to make Dronfield a heart safe community and over the coming months, we have various fundraiser and activities were we will be hard at work raising awareness. These will include a family fun day, with bouncy castles and face painting, while supporter Elliott Gallagher will be undertaking 3 x 10k runs in aid of Heidi's campaign.


# Camden

We are delighted to share the news that a number for schools in the Camden area of London will shortly be supported and receive defibrillator and training packages courtesy of Rosh and her supporters. Rosh is the mum to Ani who sadly lost her life due to sudden cardiac arrest.

As Rosh states "My daughter Ani died from Sudden Cardiac Arrest (SCA) on 17th October 2002. She was 14 years old, a vibrant and passionate

member of her school, Camden School for Girls in London. (CSG). She would be up early every morning to meet up with friends and always spoke with such love and enthusiasm for the school, a true Camden Girl!

This has impacted me, therefore in memory of my daughter's time at CSG, I am raising 10K to fund the purchase of Defibrillator machines including training for the school and 9 other nominated Camden Schools.



A quote Rosh received from The Baroness Tessa Jowell on hearing of her Camden campaign stated "Hand on Heart is a wonderful initiative that will save lives. It is particularly poignant as it was prompted by Rosh's families tragic loss in Ani's death. I am delighted to support it particularly as, when I was Public Health Minister I started the programme of defibrillators in public places. Congratulations on this invaluable asset for young people's health."

So far with Rosh's efforts we can make Camden School for Girls safe with a further 8 schools in the Camden area receiving their defib and training packages following her fundraising event which was held in June. Watch this space for more news on Rosh's progress. The whole team at Hand on Heart wish Rosh and supporters well and success.
